The Coalition experienced a 35% increase in food assistance requests for June, 2011 when compared to May, 2011.

Despite donations received from Covenant Churches and other organizations, the Coalition spends almost \$80,000 each year to feed Moore County's hungry. 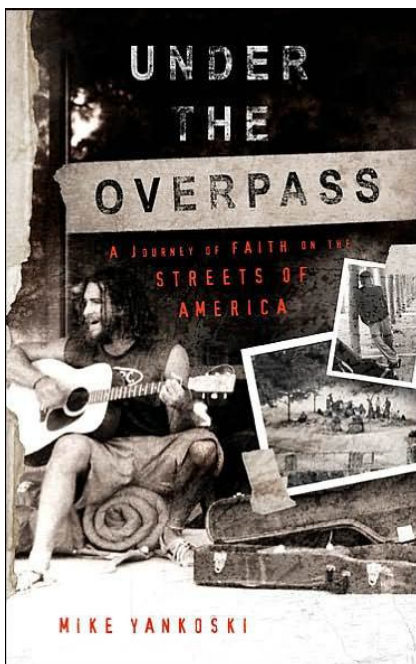

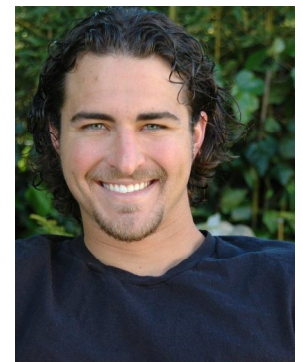
